## Clatsop Community College IOB DESCRIPTION

### **Instructor – Historic Preservation and Restoration**

## **Job Summary**

Under general supervision of the Dean of Workforce Education and Training, works collaboratively to provide Historic Preservation and Restoration Construction instruction for community college students.

**Reports to:** Dean of Workforce Education and Training

#### **Essential Duties**

- 1. Design and implement instructional activities in historic preservation and restoration in classroom and workshop settings, using sound instructional delivery techniques and, at times, which meet the needs of students and project partners (e.g. days, evenings, and weekends).
- 2. Have a background in and be able to provide classroom instruction in construction safety, tool use and safety, building assessment and documentation, Secretary of the Interior's Standards, print reading, construction math, historic and modern materials and methods.
- 3. Have a background in and be able to instruct hands-on workshops in at least three of the following areas: woodworking, construction techniques (framing, finish work, stairs, siding, doors and windows, etc.), plastering, stained glass, masonry, concrete, moisture and thermal protection, and materials analysis.
- 4. Maintain and develop relationships with program partners, including non-profits, governmental, community organizations, and businesses.
- 5. Provide curricular guidance for historic preservation and restoration.
- 6. Work with faculty colleagues to develop, implement, evaluate and periodically review and revise the organizing framework, learning outcomes, and curriculum of the college.
- 7. Evaluate student achievement of identified learning outcomes and assign grades according to college policies and standards.
- 8. Provide for student evaluations of teaching and learning effectiveness.
- 9. Market program in local and regional area at events, fairs, and in high schools.
- 10. Work with program partners to organize weekend workshops including identifying projects, ordering materials, and determining logistics.
- 11. Provide academic advising to students.
- 12. Participate in determining academic policies and procedures of the institution and other appropriate faculty activities of the College.
- 13. Maintain office hours.
- 14. Maintain woodworking shop utilized by full-time and part-time faculty, students, and maintenance staff.
- 15. Maintain professional competence and job qualifications.
- 16. Perform other duties as assigned.

#### **Minimum Qualifications:**

- 1. Bachelor's degree or Associate's Degree in Historic Preservation, Construction/Carpentry, or closely related field and a background of at least five (5) years of verifiable work experience in the Historic Preservation field; OR Seven (7) years of professional work experience related to this field. Teaching in the subject area will be considered work experience.
- 2. Teaching experience at the secondary or post-secondary level.

- 3. Knowledge of building codes
- 4. Knowledge of HABS/HAER standards
- 5. Communicate effectively through drawing and sketching
